17a. Selection and Evaluation Process

All proposals will undergo a two-stage evaluation process: **eligibility screening** and **ranking**.

- Eligibility Screening (WP5)

Proposals will be reviewed to ensure compliance with the call requirements. New initiatives are eligible for funding. Existing initiatives may also be considered if they include a clearly defined extension, scaling-up activity, or broadening of scope. Only members of EUPeace partner universities are eligible to apply.

- Ranking (EDIB)

Eligible proposals will be assessed according to several criteria, including the clarity and coherence of the proposal, its relevance to the objectives of the call, its level of innovation and added value, the feasibility of the planned activities, the expected impact, the potential for transferability and replicability across the Alliance, and the possible sustainability of the initiative beyond the funding period.

The final funding decision will be made by the Steering Committee (SC) based on the recommendations of the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Board (EDIB), the overall quality of proposals, and the available budget. Partial funding may be awarded where appropriate.



17b. Reporting Requirements

Successful applicants will be required to provide a short project summary and contact details for publication on the EUPeace website within two weeks of selection. Upon completion of the project, and no later than 15 July 2027, they must submit a financial report to their local EUPeace coordinator as well as an internal report describing the implementation and outcomes of the initiative for evaluation purposes. In addition, a final summary of project outcomes must be provided for publication on the EUPeace website within two weeks of project completion and no later than 15 July 2027.
